Message from Diane Stores

Dear Friends,

I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy, fo r your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now. Philippians 1:3 - 5

Once again, we experienced explosive growth this past year! All of this happened because of your dedicated hours of volunteering, your faithful financial support and most of all your prayers for us and for the precious ones we serve. We could not do this without you.

In 2019 support group offerings increased by 102%. We went from 20 support groups in 2018 to 41 support groups in 2019. The participants in these groups increased 89% for a total of 269 women, children and men served. Our trauma recovery prayer ministry recipients went from 135 clients in 2018 to 229 clients in 2019 – a 69% increase in one

year. We also held three conferences and three workshops during the year which brought lifegiving information into the hands of 294 people. God has been on the move and your commitment has been the fuel that empowered this amazing growth.

Two more exciting advancements this past year have been the expansion into Cloquet and Mankato. We now have staff in both locations and are offering support groups, trauma recovery prayer ministry and conferences and workshops at these locations as well. We have a physical office in Mankato and are praying for God's right space and right time for a Cloquet office.

From Door of Hope's inception God has called us to the nations. It was a wonderful surprise to realize that He was calling us to our wonderful brothers and sisters in the First Nations first. We started support groups on the Fond du Lac Reservation. Bill and Diana Sutter from Sawyer Chapel have opened their church and their hearts to us to allow us to minister to the Ojibwe people.

We expanded our workshop offerings by adding *How to Trauma Proof Your Kids*. Also, in partnership with Freedom Counseling Center we developed a new workshop *on Bringing Healing and Joy to Your Communities*.

Jesus keeps telling me that we are still a toddler – having been in our ministry center for only four years. I cannot wait to see what kindergarten looks like. I think He has big plans!

Thank you from the bottom of my heart for your faithful prayers and your faithful support. You are making a huge difference in the lives of so many.

Programs



Support Groups

Adults, teens, and children dealing with the effects of abuse find a safe place to learn, grow, and share with others.

Groups are nine weeks long, and are held four times a year.

In 2019, our support group offerings increased from 20 to 41 serving 170 (102% increase over 2018): 127 women, 27 men, 6 teens and 10 children. Since most of our clients join more than one support group, the total number of support group attendees grew 89% to 269.



Conferences and Workshops

In our workshops, pastors, ministry leaders and lay people are taught the complex dynamics of abuse, and trained to effectively minister to those who have experienced abuse.

In 2019, we held three women's conferences and three workshops, serving 294 people. We also oversaw prayer teams at two ministry partners' events that hosted a total of 3,500+ guests.



Trauma Recovery Prayer Ministry

Adults, teens and children who receive our individual trauma recovery prayer ministry find freedom and life-changing transformation from the deep wounding caused by abuse.

In 2019, 135 clients (up 69% from 2018) received 229 trauma recovery prayer ministry sessions, resulting in 458 hours of prayer ministry.



Crisis Help and Safe Housing

Women seeking crisis help receive one-onone counseling to help them minimize the danger of leaving an unsafe situation and are offered referrals on where to go if they leave, including our safe home.

In 2019, 20 women received crisis counseling and one women and her three children found rest and hope in our safe home.


16 Children & Teens Served



In 2019, we served 16 children & teens ages 10-17, through our Hope-Filled Kids and Hope-Filled Teens Support Groups.

2019 Turning Points

Beauty Instead of Ashes Women's Conferences in 2019. We were in Cloquet in January, Mankato in March, and Blaine, Minnesota in June. After hosting the conferences in Cloquet and Mankato, we launched support groups in those areas that filled to capacity right after the conference!

Diane Stores and Jodi Hill ministered in Cuenca, Ecuador in March 2019. Diane did some teaching at the Assemblies of God church in Cuenca.

We also offered some new workshops in 2019: How Abuse Affects Brain Development and Identity (Blaine), Bringing Joy & Healing to our Communities (Mankato), and How to Trauma Proof Your Kids. These workshops help men and women learn more about healing from trauma and how to come alongside others.

EXPANSION and GROWTH!

We hired a Cloquet Director and we are currently partnering with local churches who let us use space for support groups and prayer ministry. We hired a Mankato Director and Program Coordinator and we are renting office space in Mankato.

We also hired a new Men's Director, Jon Mogck, who is leading support groups and Trauma Recovery Prayer Appointments for the men who are coming to us for healing.



Support Group Testimonial

My whole life I have struggled with the details of my early childhood. When law enforcement became involved, they discovered **our family had spent the last 3 years on the run**. It had all started with child abuse allegations. These three years were filled with abuse, incest, neglect, hospital visits and falsified documents with fake names. While I was young, there are

many memories I have some of which include being held under water while I struggled to breathe and another time I was forced to eat human feces out of the toilet. My brother was beaten so bad that twice there is evidence of him having been in a body cast. It all came to an end after I witnessed, at age 5, my older brother being physically beaten to death by our father. It's hard to believe. I recall contemplating suicide at the age of six after I had just entered my second foster home. Growing up without proper counseling left me continually feeling depressed and extremely angry with God and people.

While I found my first glimpse of hope in healing with my husband, some close friends, and counseling with our current pastor, overall I find Door of Hope Ministries to be unique by what I discovered when going through the "Authentic Hope" study. Here was one of the first places where I heard that forgiving someone is not to be confused with trusting your abuser. Relationships cannot continue if both parties cannot come together. Not fully understanding this often times lead to the victim trying to repair the damage themselves and then stepping back into that same abusive relationship only to be hurt again which was the case with me. "Family Fun Walk" in Blaine, MN was a new turning point in my healing. The event landed on the anniversary of my brother's death. It was a great opportunity to begin speaking out about my family's experience and then to see so many friends support us. The Mankato "Trama Proofing Your Children" seminar did a fantastic job of describing the physical development of a person's brain. I walked away being amazed on how much I learned in understanding how and why my childhood abuse affected me so much then as it still does today.

I'm so thankful for God's provision, and allowing me the opportunity to give my children the childhood I never had. As more of my healing takes place, I am surprised to discover how much I'm learning about myself. While I use to be the angry little girl that even foster parents couldn't enjoy the company of. I'm blossoming into a woman that enjoys gardening, quilting, hunting, archery and learning to play the piano. In other words, I'm learning how to enjoy life. This year my husband and I will celebrate 14 years of marriage. We will continue to stay active in our church and homeschool our children on our hobby farm in south central MN. I do believe there will some day be complete healing from my depression, but until then I'll continue to grow closer to God while being a good steward with what He has given me.

Thanks to Door of Hope for all the hope, healing and understanding they've brought into my life.






